I- Education:

A) Support of the Education of Poor Children in AUEED Schools:

AUEED received from PACHE 45,300 CAD for children education, utilized as follows:

A total amount of CAD 23,586 for children education in Kom Gharib School (270 children):

A total amount of CAD 21,714 (751,100 EGP) for 102 Children education in other AUEED Schools:

- 4 children were sponsored by the Djandi family in Zarabi School
- 40 children were sponsored by 32 PACHE partners in Wasta School
- 58 other children were sponsored by PACHE in Wasta and Zarabi Schools

B) <u>Basic Education for the Poor in Upper Egypt – Fire-fighting and Technology:</u>

AUEED received a total amount of **CAD 25,000 (EGP 846,750)** from PACHE for equipment. The total amount spent was **EGP 711,441** amount was used (and there is still a balance of **EGP 153,309**) to provide equipment for the schools, as follows:

- Fire prevention Boxes
- Fire prevention Equipment
- Computers, Printers and Accessories
- Transportation of Equipment to Upper Egypt

II- School Health:

A) Health and Nutrition Project in 18 Schools in Assiut, Sohag and Qena:

PACHE contributed an amount of **CAD 59,695 (EGP 2,064,850)** in 23/24 and there was an amount carried forward of **(EGP 1,006,707)** from 22/23. And, **AAUE** contributed with **US \$15,000 (EGP 699,000)** in 23/24. The funds of the AAUE were completely utilized. The fund of PACHE was almost fully utilized, with a positive balance of **(EGP 97,044)** to be transferred to the following year budget.

Project Outcomes:

Medical check-up for 5569 children in the 18 schools; resulting in discovering the following diseases and referring them to the health insurance clinic for medical intervention.

- ♣ Blood analysis was carried for 5142 the children in the 18 schools; resulting in discovering:
 - o 956 children suffering from anemia & malnutrition
- Providing nutrition to 956 children suffering from anemia and malnutrition
- Providing iron syrup to 956 children suffering from anemia; as per doctors' prescriptions
- Building children awareness through Children Health groups
- Raising health and hygiene awareness for parents

B) Disability Project in Kom Gharib:

PACHE contributed an amount of CAD 10,000 (EGP 345,900) for the Disability Project in Kom Gharib. The total amount spent was EGP 207,396 and used as follows: Establishing and equipping the Disability Resource Center in Kom Gharib School, more equipment and materials still to be added and a shadow teacher to be hired and trained. The activities of the Rehabilitation Center in Kom Gharib MCH Center started, more equipment still to be added a physiotherapist to be hired. The remaining balance of EGP 138,504 will not cover all planned activities.

Report on AUEED in General

I- The Association:

- Currently working in some 500 villages in Upper Egypt. It has 3 main departments: Programs; Fundraising & External Relations; and Finance & Administration. It has 4 offices in Upper Egypt for managing programs' implementation and follow-up, Hotel Training Center & Hostel in AboKorkas Menya, 9 Micro-finance offices, 35 schools, 65 development centers and training & production workshops.
- ♣ Is registered with the Ministry of Social Solidarity (MoSS) under no 576/2009, and is regularly audited by it. As per the new law:
 - o The Financial Year ended in 30/6/2024
 - Annual MoSS Audit was held.
 - o Annual external Audit was held
- ♣ AUEED schools are audited by the Ministry of Education.
- Regularly reports to the Ministry of Finance:
 - o Financial Regulatory Authority FRA الهيئة العامة للرقابة المالية
 - وحدة مكافحة غسل الأموال وتمويل الإرهاب Money Laundering Countering Unit MLCU
 - o Accountability State Authority ASA الجهاز المركزي للمحاسبات
- ♣ AUEED's finances are also audited by an internationally accredited External Auditor (Prime Global Rizk Wadid Rizkalla).
- ♣ The General Assembly annually approves the Audit Report, Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Statement and Receivables & Payables Statement.
- → AUEED has its own internal Auditing Unit, Risks Prevention Unit & Money Laundering Prevention Unit reporting directly to AUEED's President.

II- The Programs:

A- Formal Education Program:

- ♣ 12,876 children received quality education in 35 schools, served by 1000 teachers & staff.

 Some 687 children received full scholarships and 8095 children had partial financial support.
- ♣ The total cost of education in AUEED schools is EGP 84,185,416 (CAD 2.5 million). Fees paid by children's parents who can afford to pay (both full & partial fees) represented 78% of the income; 16% is covered by international & national donors and 6% by AUEED.
- 20 schools accredited by National Authority for Quality Assurance & Accreditation (NAQAAE).

B- Non-Formal Education Program:

- ↓ 1431 children received quality education in 16 parallel schools and other non-formal education, in addition to life skills and health interventions. 180 graduates continued their preparatory education in government schools and 50 were supported by AUEED.
- 196 children at the verge of dropping out benefited from education support sessions.
- 763 students and their mothers benefited from skills development training.
- AUEED started the "Valuable Girl" project in Nag' el Seyagh Luxor, funded by Coptic Orphans.

C- Health Program:

- 10,484 children, enrolled in AUEED schools and parallel schools' benefit from the Health & Nutrition projects.
- ➡ 717 pregnant & lactating mothers and 722 infants benefited from the MCH program and 381 children with Disability benefited from the Disability program.
- 4 6,257 community members benefited from the various dispensaries and laboratories.

D- Cultural Development Program:

4 2,500 children & youth beneficiaries of Cultural centers, Choirs, Tahtib, Scouts and Sports.

E- Micro-finance:

- → Some 4,886 clients (44% women) benefited from the Micro-finance with a total portfolio of EGP 52 million (CAD 1.5 million).
- 1270 women & youth benefited from the non-financial services (training, coaching, etc.)

F- Skills Development Program:

Some 170 girls & women benefited from Akhmim Center as well as the Tailoring workshops in Menya & Alexandria.
